PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Three months of the Bar year have now elapsed. This is my initial report to you on our progress and direction for 1981-1982.

The Association is effective only to the extent its Committees and staff are effective. The meeting of Section and Committee Chairpersons was most successful. All Committees and Sections are active and functioning.

As of this printing, the Association has accomplished:

- (1) Implementation of the Pilot Program to Reduce Court Delay in the Civil Division. This commenced on August 31 under supervision of Civil Litigation Coordinating Council, James H. Walden, Chairman.
- (2) Co-hosting with the Supreme Court of Florida and Palm Beach County Bar Association, the National Conference of Chief Justices and National Conference of State Court Administrators. This Conference took place in Boca Raton August 1-5. President-Elect, Hugh T. Maloney, chaired our Special Committee.
- (3) Distribution of Legal Resource Directory to Broward County news media. The Directory provides resource persons who are available to provide background information to the media in various areas of the law. This is a project of the Public Relations Committee, Ben J. Weaver, Chairman.

(4) Authorized expansion of Lawyer Referral Service advertising to increase availability of legal services and increased referrals to members of the Lawyer Referral Panel. Charles M. Daniels is Chairman of the Lawyer Referral Committee.

(5) Assisted Chief Judge Atkins of United States District Court in expanding list of attorneys willing to accept indigent criminal defense cases in Federal Court. This was accomplished by the staff.

(6) Conducted an Educational Campaign to make lawyers aware of

FIFTH AND ELEVENTH CIRCUITS ADMISSION PROCEDURES

Members of the Broward Bar who are admitted to practice before the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals should be aware that the Fifth Circuit goes out of business on October 1, 1981.

A new Fifth Circuit, comprising the States of Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi, and a new Eleventh Circuit (Florida, Georgia and Alabama) will replace the "old" Fifth.

If you wish to be admitted to the new Eleventh Circuit, *you* (not your firm) must do the following by December 31, 1981:

1. Write the Clerk of the Fifth Circuit, 600 Camp Street, New Orleans, Louisiana 70013.
2. Certify you are a member in good standing of the Bar of the Fifth Circuit.
3. State your wish to be admitted to the Eleventh Circuit.
4. Give your social security number.
5. Send a check for \$5.00 made payable to the Clerk of the Fifth Circuit.

You may elect to be admitted to *both* new circuits. An additional fee of \$20.00 (\$25.00 total fee) is required. Advise the Clerk of your election.

Members of The Florida Bar have been invited to the Governor's Mansion on Wednesday, October 14, 1981, from 6:30 P.M. — 8:00 P.M. to join Governor Bob Graham, Chief Justice Alan Sundberg, Attorney General Jim Smith, Florida Bar President, Sam Smith and Corrections' Secretary, Louie Wainwright, for a reception.

This meeting will provide an opportunity to discuss and solicit your support for The Florida Pilot Grievance

Procedure Project. This one-year pilot project will provide a mechanism whereby volunteer lawyers, acting as neutral fact-finders in Broward Correctional Institution, will review the facts surrounding inmate complaints filed through the Department's grievance process. Broward Correctional Institution houses female offenders and is located 1.5 miles north of Hollywood Boulevard.

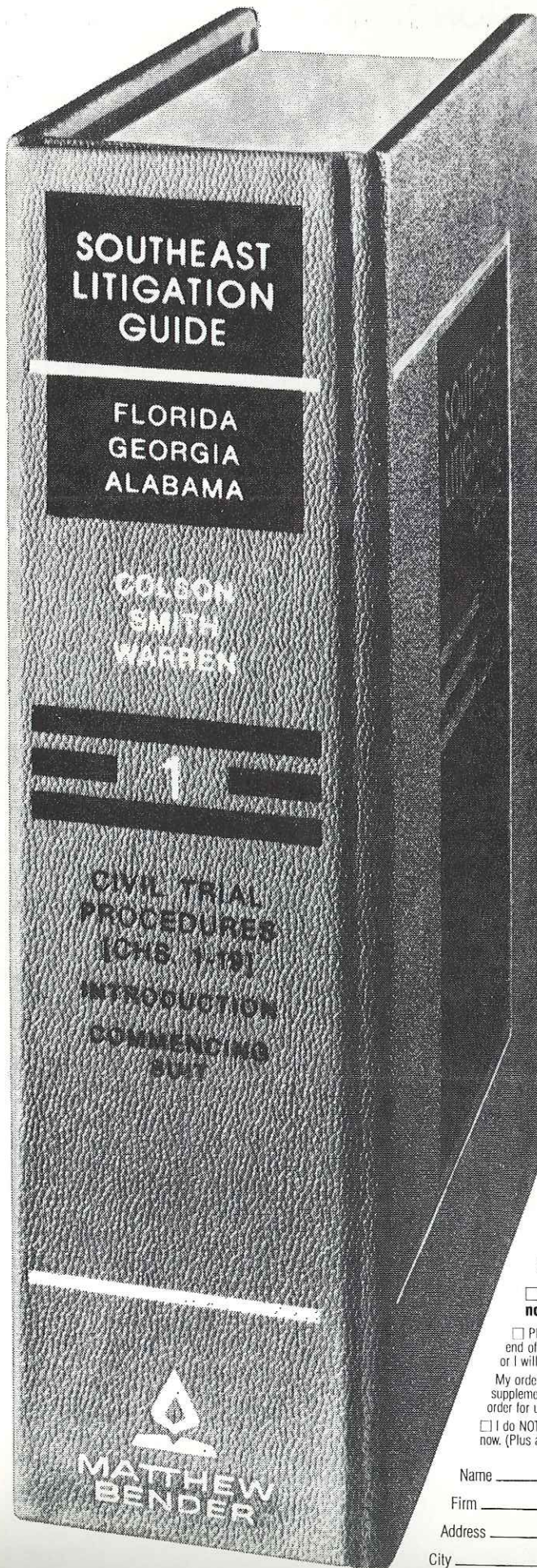

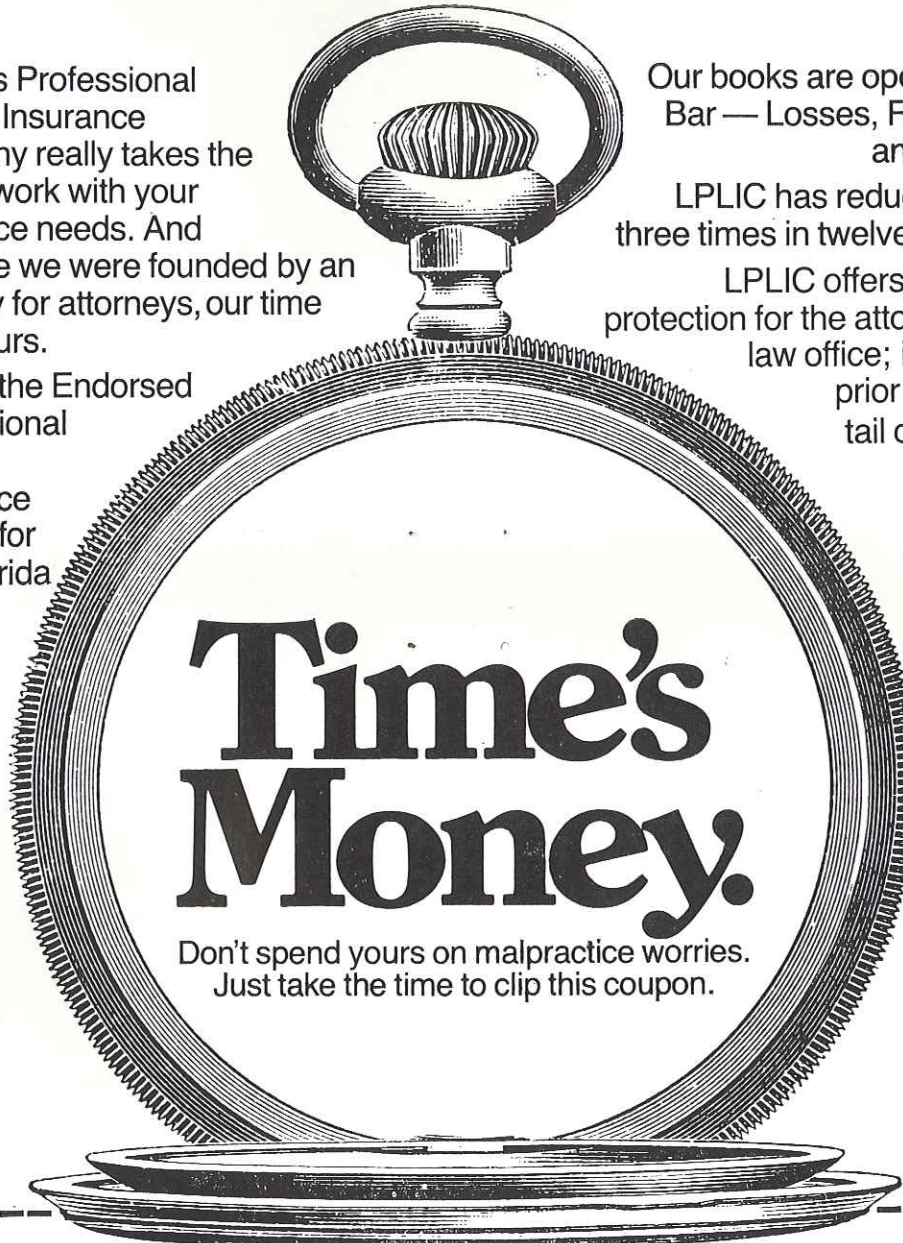
