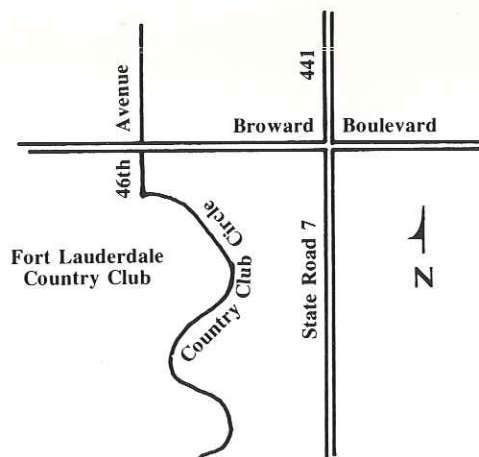

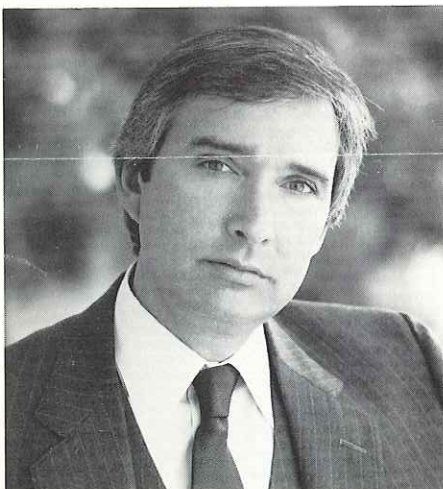

State Representative James Harold Thompson is a native of Gadsden County, Florida, where his family has lived for five generations. He is married to the former Carolyn Messer of Bonifay and they have three children, Jason, James Alexander and Lee Anne. He is a member of the Presbyterian faith and is

Sunday School Superintendent, teacher and an Elder of the Gretna Presbyterian Church. He graduated from Florida State University College of Law with honors in 1969 and practices law in Quincy.

Representative Thompson was elected to the Florida House of Representatives in 1974 and serves District 8 which includes all of Gadsden County and parts of Franklin, Jackson, Calhoun, Gulf and Bay Counties. He is Chairman of the Committee on Rules and Calendar and serves on the committees of Appropriations, Commerce, Finance and Taxation, Transportation and Community Affairs. He also serves on the Select Committee on Growth Management and is Chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee on Children and Youth.

His colleagues in the House of Representatives recognized him during the last four regular sessions as "The Most Effective in Debate." Why is it that every time that we open up a newspaper we are greeted with the type of media attack evidenced by the cartoon and letter to the editor reprinted in this issue. On December 19, 1984, the *Fort Lauderdale News/Sun-Sentinel* presented us with the aforementioned season's greetings. Isn't it a clever cartoon that Dick Wright prepared for Scripps-Howard Newspapers? Our profession is caricatured by Mr. Wright as the figure of a man in an undersized striped suit, unkempt, and appearing for all the world to see as the reincarnation of Blackbeard the Pirate. Of course, the cleverness of the cartoon was only exceeded by the glibness of the editorial letter accompanying it, authored by a fellow from that bastion of legal wisdom . . . Lauderdale.

The writer of the letter (obviously an expert on the American system of jurisprudence) said that American lawyers in India would turn the Indian court system

Board of Governors' Report

At a recent meeting of the Board of Governors in Clearwater from January 10th through the 12th, various matters were considered by the Board which should be of interest to all the members of the Broward County Bar.

Mandatory CLE. Dean Tom Reed, Chairman of the Committee, presented the tentative proposals of the Committee which are to be reported at the March meeting of the Board. The Committee will recommend that mandatory CLE be required of members of the Bar. The Board has not voted on this concept and it will be voted upon at the March meeting.

Iota law suit. The Board was advised of the pending Iota law suit which has been discussed in the *Florida Bar News*. Plaintiff seeks to have the federal court declare the Iota program to be unconstitutional and to have all attorneys who are participating in the program be made members of a defendant class. The case has not proceeded to a determination of class or as to the merits at this time and the presiding judge, George C. Carr, has recently recused himself from the case.

Equitable distribution. The Family Law Section of The Florida Bar is attempting to have a bill enacted by the Legislature which provides for equitable distribution of property upon dissolution of marriage and it seeks permission of the Board to present the bill to the Legislature. Action on the Section's request was deferred at the Clearwater meeting.

Direct solicitation of injured parties. The Board was advised of the recent decision of the New York Court of Appeals which held that an attorney could contact injured parties by direct mail solicitation and that such action was protected by the U.S. Constitution. The Board is considering taking an amicus position, in the event the case proceeds to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Alcoholic abuse intervention program. The Board has adopted a proposed alcoholic abuse intervention program to assist those attorneys with alcoholic problems. Aid for persons requiring such assistance should be requested from The Florida Bar.

(if they have one) into a "replica of the laughable shambles" that is "the American system of jurisprudence."

I spoke with Jim Gay, an executive editor of the *Fort Lauderdale News/Sun-Sentinel*. I warned him that anything he said might be used in this publication. Not being as clever at ferreting out the truth as some local newspaper reporters, I said to him, "Why did you print this ---?" He replied, "Because there is apparently some ambulance chasing going on over there in India." He drew that conclusion from other news reports.

If there is "ambulance chasing" going on in India as a result of the terrible accident that occurred there then that is a genuine cause for concern. We don't know if any of that activity is going on or not. Unfortunately, most of America believes it is, because most of America reads the newspapers.

The overwhelming majority of attorneys in this nation are highly ethical and deserve better treatment from the media. The letter, the cartoon, and the actions of the *Fort Lauderdale News/Sun-Sentinel* in printing both together were just irresponsible.

Incidentally, the fellows at Scripps-Howard Newspapers gave me permission to reprint the cartoon and asked for appropriate credit. Likewise at the *Fort Lauderdale News/Sun-Sentinel*. I think we should give them all the credit they deserve. Don't you?

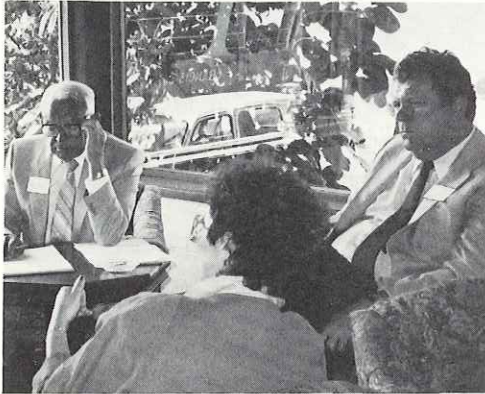
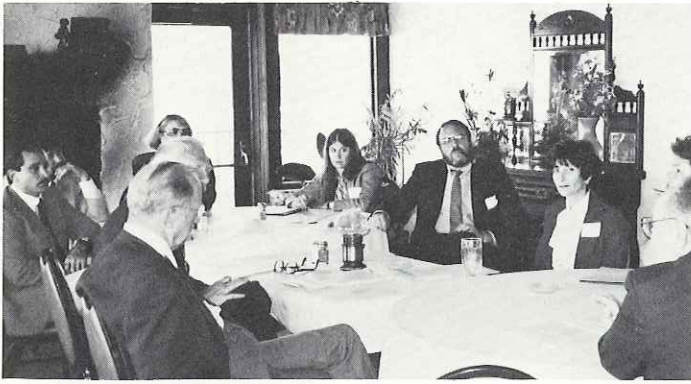
