## FOR ALL ATTORNEYS REPRESENTING INDIVIDUALS CHARGED WITH A MISDEMEANOR

Notice is hereby given to all attorneys representing individuals charged with a misdemeanor offense in Broward County and wishing to resolve their case. The 17<sup>th</sup> Judicial County Court will be organizing a docket to resolve such cases remotely. Cases may be resolved either by telephone or by using the zoom platform.

The requirements to place such a case on a docket are:

- If the resolution is pursuant to a plea agreement between the state and the defendant, all
  parties and the defendant must stipulate to resolving the case remotely
- 2. If the defendant is pleading open to the court, the defendant and defense counsel must stipulate to resolving the case remotely
- 3. All necessary paperwork to resolve the case must be signed and completed prior to the case being heard by the court
- 4. The Defendant must be present or a waiver of appearance and plea in absentia must be executed by the defendant and filed with the clerk of court
- 5. All hearings will be conducted remotely, no face-to-face contact
- 6. The clerk of court and court reporter will attend the hearings remotely
- 7. If an interpreter is needed, it is the responsibility of defense counsel to arrange for the interpreter and the interpreter will be permitted to attend remotely
- 8. Any attorney wishing to place a case on the docket for resolution shall contact Judge

- If the Court determines the case meets criteria, a date, time and mechanism of the hearing (phone or zoom) will be provided to all counsel
- 10. The Court reserves the right to accept or reject any case from this special docket
- 11. Prior to the case being heard by the Court all efforts must be made for Defense counsel to contact the State Attorney's Office and enter into plea discussions
