## The Honorable Elijah H. Williams



Judge Elijah Williams entered the University of Florida at the age of 16 and earned a bachelor's, master's, and Juris Doctorate degree.

From 1984-1990, he served as a captain (JAG Officer) in the United States Air Force. He became the Chief of Military Justice at the largest tactical fighter wing.

In March 1988, he authored the landmark article "DNA Fingerprinting-Into the 21st Century".

After serving as a Broward assistant state attorney (1990-1992), he was hired by the Law Firm of Whitelock, Soloff and Rodriquez, PA. He was made a named-partner in 1995.

From 1993 – 2002, he served as legal counsel at the Broward Sheriff's Office.

In March 2002, Governor Jeb Bush appointed Elijah Williams to Broward's Circuit Court, where he initially presided in the adult felony division.

Judge Williams currently presides in the juvenile delinquency division.
