Dominick L. Stokes is an Ordained Elder in the Church of Jesus Christ. He has served in ministry for over 25 years. Dominick was trained and licensed as a Minister in 1997 by Bishop Ralph L. Dennis at Kingdom Worship Center in Towson, MD, ordained in 2001 and reaffirmed as an Ordained Elder in 2005. Dominick has assisted in Church building, Ministry operations and the development of several Christian organizations.

Dominick served as a Missionary at the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta, GA for the Southern Baptist Convention, teaching and preaching the gospel to thousands. Elder Stokes has served as a Senior Residential Treatment Counselor working with at risk and emotionally disturbed youth at Villa Maria Residential Treatment Center and the Saint Vincent's Center in Timonium, MD, which is owned and operate by Associated Catholic Charities.

Dominick has served as a Special Agent with the United States Government for 18 years and currently serves as the Vice President for the Federal Law Enforcement Officers Association (FLEOA). Prior to his law enforcement career, Dominick was selected to the Presidential Management Fellows Program in Washington, DC and served as an Executive Assistant to a George W. Bush Presidential Appointee for two years.

Dominick has received several meritorious awards for investigative excellence including the coveted U.S. Department of Homeland Security's William R. Barton Award for outstanding professionalism and integrity at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in 2006. Dominick received two awards from the Inspector General Council in Miami, FL in 2016. The first award was under the category "Complex Financial Crime Investigation", and the second award in the "Teamwork Investigation". In 2018, Dominick was awarded the FLEOA Foundation Award for Investigative Excellence. In 2019, Dominick received the Outstanding Law Enforcement Officer of the Year (OLEO) Award from the United States Department of Justice, United States Attorney's Office in the Southern District of Florida. In 2022, Dominick received the Inspector General Honorary Award for his work on Diversity Equity and Inclusion in the Federal Government.

Dominick is a Volunteer Program Manager for the Elite Foundation, Guardians of Hope an Anti-Human Trafficking Non-Profit Organization.
