THE 17th JUDICIAL CIRCUIT ANNOUNCES ONLINE SCHEDULING

Circuit Civil Division 13 (Judge Jack Tuter) is pleased to announce a pilot project that will allow for requesting and cancellation of UMC hearings, via an online web based system.

The goals of this project are to allow users to self-set 8:45 motions; view and change the dates motions are set; alleviate the necessity of calling judicial assistants to confirm, cancel or change hearings set on motion calendar.

Judges Tuter, Carney and Tobin will evaluate the project after substantial usage and implement any necessary changes to make the program as user friendly and efficient as possible.

The system will eventually be available to all general civil division judges once the stability and functionality of the system is fully tested.

Local Rule 10 A and all Florida Rules of Civil Procedure are not changed.

The online system is simply an electronic way of self - scheduling motions. All motions must have been filed before scheduling any hearing and a courtesy copy of the motion must be mailed to the Judge's Judicial Assistant. Users having cases in Division (13) are encouraged to participate and learn how the program works. Judges Tuter, Tobin and Carney want to offer special recognition to the JIS unit of Court Administration for their tireless work in setting up and helping to implement the program. RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE LAW

1. Child Custody/ UCCJEA Karam v. Karam. 34 Fla. L. Weekly D544 (Fla. 3d DCA March 11, 2009).

Although a proceeding concerning custody had been commenced in a

French court, the Third District held that Florida could exercise jurisdiction over the custody issue because the French court did not exercise its jurisdiction substantially in conformity with the UCCJEA. Under the UCCJEA, Florida would be the children's home state, whereas the French court applied different jurisdictional criteria. Accordingly, the trial court departed from the essential requirements of law in dismissing the custody portion of the wife's petition for dissolution of marriage.

2. Civil Procedure/Default Movnet v. Courtois. 34 Fla. L. Weekly D401 (Fla. 3rd DCA February 18,

In an action for civil theft, the defendant did not answer and suffered a default judgment. In her motion to vacate, she failed to show excusable neglect, instead arguing that the complaint had failed to state a cause of action. Because there was no showing of excusable neglect, the trial court denied the motion. On appeal the Third District reversed, holding that even though there was no showing of excusable neglect, the judgment could not stand because the complaint failed to state a cause of action.

3. Civil Procedure/Notice of Evidentiary Hearing Herranz v. Siam,

34 Fla. L. Weekly D400 (Fla. 3rd DCA February 18,

After the trial court granted a motion to strike a complaint as a sham pleading, based on testimony received at a motion calendar hearing, the Third District reversed because the notice setting the hearing on a motion calendar did not specify that it was to be an evidentiary hearing. The court noted that although a trial judge is not prohibited from hearing testimony at a motion calendar on an undisputed matter, specific notice of intention to allow testimony on a contested matter must be given in advance of the hearing in order to allow the other party a reasonable opportunity to prepare.

4. Covenant Not to Compete Miller v. Preefer, 34 Fla. L. Weekly D383 (Fla. 4th DCA February 18, 2009).

Although a non-competition covenant did not satisfy the relationship requirements of the applicable statute and acted as a restraint of trade, the Fourth District held that it could not declare it unenforceable because the covenant had previously been incorporated into a final judgment resolving a prior lawsuit. The court held that it essentially became "sheltered within the judgment" as a result of the settlement agreement in the prior case, and it could not thereafter be collaterally challenged in the present declaratory action.

5. Intentional Interference with Custodial Relationship

Stewart v. Walker,

34 Fla. L. Weekly D441 (Fla. 4th DCA February 25,

In a dispute between the unwed parents of a child, both appearing pro se, the Fourth District affirmed a trial court's decision that the father had no standing regarding his claim of intentional interference in custodial rights. However, the court held that the concept of standing in terms of custodial rights was irrelevant to his additional claim of intentional infliction of emotional distress based on the mother's removal of their child from the state. Accordingly, it reversed the dismissal of that portion of the father's complaint.

6. Medical Malpractice/Contribution Healthcare Staffing Solutions, Inc. v. Wilkinson, 34 Fla. L. Weekly D406 (Fla. 1st DCA February 19,

After a medical malpractice suit was settled, with the hospital funding the settlement, the hospital sought contribution from the medical staffing service which provided the traveling nurse who was primarily responsible for the patient's care. Although the service proffered evidence of negligence by certain physicians, the trial court held that this was irrelevant in the contribution action. On appeal, the First District reversed, holding that the contribution statute required a determination of the "entire liability," and that, as in the case of Fabre defendants, the court was required to consider the relative degrees of fault of "all other actors who contributed to the injury."

Legal Aid Service of Broward County and The Broward County Bar Association Team Up to Fight Foreclosure

Plantation (February 26, 2009) -- Legal Aid Service of Broward County (LAS) and The Broward County Bar Association recently held a free CLE Seminar on basic foreclosure, followed by three foreclosure clinics in a joint effort to combat the growing crisis.

"In Broward the foreclosure rate is estimated at more than 300 times the national average, leaving countless low-income families homeless due to lack of legal counsel," said Kimberly L. Zaffere, Pro Bono Coordinator for LAS.

The CLE Seminar was held at the Norma B. Howard Center on November 14, 2008. LAS Attorney Shawn C. Boehringer and Florida Debt Relief Center, LLC Attorney Jeffrey H. Tromberg. spoke about the legal issues surrounding foreclosure, emphasizing ways to help low-income homeowners avoid foreclosure. Approximately 25 attorneys attended the seminar, each of whom received four CLE credits for his/her participation in the event.

Participating attorneys agreed to attend a foreclosure clinic at LAS and accept one or two clinic cases for further pro bono representation. Foreclosure Clinics were held at the Legal Aid Center for Law and Social Justice in Plantation on November 19, 2008, December 18, 2008, and February 3, 2009. A total of 44 individuals received FREE one hour consultations. Twenty-one private practice attorneys volunteered in the clinics, each agreeing to take one or two foreclosure cases on a pro bono basis.

Legal Aid Service of Broward County (LAS) is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit law firm and has been providing free civil legal services to Broward County children, families and senior citizens in the low income and underserved communities for 35 years. Last year LAS assisted over 10,000 family members and over 3000 children at no charge. LAS also manages the largest pro bono program in Broward County, Broward Lawyers Care (BLC).

THE ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF DELAYS IN CIVIL TRIALS IN FLORIDA'S STATE COURTS DUE TO UNDER-FUNDING

From The Executive Summary of a report prepared for the Florida Bar By The Washington Economics Group, Inc.

Due to Florida's growing population and the significant increase in the number of Real Property/Mortgage Foreclosure cases filed, the court caseload throughout the State has grown dramatically and, as a result, has created growing and serious backlogs within the court system. This situation is adversely impacting the competitiveness of the State to create, retain and expand jobs and private-sector enterprises.

While the number of cases has increased sharply in recent years, funding of Florida's state court system has remained constant or has declined. In real terms (adjusted for inflation), funding for Florida's state courts has declined every year since FY 2004-2005. Delays within the court system create a significant burden throughout the system and on its personnel, including judges, Clerks of Court and other court administrators.

System-wide funding challenges have forced the courts to cut and/or decrease the services offered. As of October 2008, WEG estimates the backlog of civil cases to be approximately 338,000 cases. This is impacting the ability of the private sector to conduct business in Florida.

In total, the backlog of Real Property/Mortgage Foreclosure cases alone directly results in an estimated \$9.9 billion of added costs and lost property values for Floridians each year. Backlogs of other civil cases create an additional \$200 million of added costs each year.

The aggregate of all quantifiable costs associated with court-related delays in civil case adjudication results in direct economic impacts (i.e., costs to the economy) approaching \$10.1 billion annually.

These added direct costs and burdens on the economy adversely impact employment, the generation of labor income, economic output and public revenues throughout the State of Florida. In the current economic climate, the State cannot afford the loss of economic dynamism attributable to the under-funding of the court system.

An estimated 120,219 permanent jobs for Florida's residents are adversely impacted by civil case delays resulting from inadequate funding for Florida's courts. This situation will continue to deteriorate until proper funding for the court system is re-established Best Practices for court funding are based on the principles that court funding should be adequate for the courts to discharge their constitutional responsibilities, stable across budget periods, and equitable across jurisdictions in order to provide impartial justice for all citizens. Finally, the courts have a responsibility to utilize resources in an efficient manner by advancing best management products and the deployment of new technologies.

The Seven Principles for Stabilizing Court Funding recently set forth by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Florida are sound and consistent with the broad principles that underlie Best Practices in Court Funding. They will serve as an excellent starting point for discussions between the courts, the Legislature, and the Executive Branch on proper stabilization and allocation of court funding.

Seven Principles for Stabilizing Court Funding

- 1) The elements of the State Courts System codified in section 29.001, Florida Statutes, should be adequately funded by the State to ensure the guarantee of court access by Florida's citizens.
- 2) Court fees assessed and paid by Florida's citizens to access their court system should be dedicated to the court system, as already provided for by state law.
- 3) Unless adequate safeguards are in place, court-related revenue other than filing fee revenue (revenue derived from fines, service charges, and costs) should not be dedicated to court funding but used to support other justice system partners
- 4) All current court-related revenue being collected should be reevaluated to determine what portion of current filing fee revenue should be dedicated to court funding.
- 5) Additional or increased filing fees should be considered, but only after an adequate review of the distribution of the current filing fee revenue has been made.
- 6) Some components of the State Courts System are more appropriately funded from the general fund and should remain so.
- 7) State Court Trust Funds are the appropriate depositories for court filing fee revenue.


