

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The year is speeding by and I think of a time when I was a child and a neighbor said to me that the older one becomes, the faster the time flies. I believe we all know how true this is. This entire year is going by so fast and I wish someone would invent a way to make time slow down just a little. Abraham Lincoln said that all an attorney had to give was of his time. This parallels with an article my sister, Yolanda James gave to me which recently she read in a magazine

that stated it takes 25 minutes to regain your focus after an office interruption. The typical office worker labors without interruption for only 11 minutes! Time is so limited and so valuable and as everyone knows it is far more valuable than money. We are always juggling our time and so we must learn to conserve it and use it to the best we can. One way to do so is to cut down on interruptions. Some of the main causes of interruptions are as follows:

Potential visitors coming to your office either to visit or to ask questions. If you have a door to your office (some of us may not) try a closed door work session. You can even post a "do not disturb" sign that specifies the times you cannot be interrupted except in extreme emergency. If you explain to the office personnel that this new procedure of yours is "nothing personal" and you apologize if it seems rude, but that it is because you really have to get some work done and to be productive, I think everyone will understand. If your work area does not have a door, then do not face the hallway because more people will be apt to get your attention. You could also wear a telephone headset because people will think you are on the phone and less likely to interrupt. However in many offices, like mine for instance, that sometimes doesn't seem to matter because we get disturbed, interrupted, questioned and spoken to even when we really are on the phone! If a visitor does come unscheduled and unannounced to your office you may stand up and remain standing for the duration of the conversation. Your body language will tell them they should not plan on staying long.

Telephone calls throughout the day. This has always been a source of stress for me. Many of us seem to lose our entire focus when we re-focus on the telephone call. You may let your receptionist or assistant know you will not be taking calls until told otherwise. If you answer your own phone, then simply let voice-mail take over until you are done with the job at hand. I think I invented voice mail because I had a policy as a young lawyer not to take any call unless I knew who I was going to speaking to. I just do not like to be caught off-guard. Cell phones are also another source of constant stress and interruption. You be talking on your office line and your cell-phone rings, you lose focus on your conversation to glance down to see who is calling you on the cell phone. In the middle of work we receive many cell-phone calls many of which are unnecessary or frivolous. Let the voice mail pick up and return calls according to your schedule. In past years it was acceptable to return a call within 24 hours or on the next business day. Nowadays with immediate gratification being the norm, many require an immediate return call. I like it better the way old way and still think it is appropriate. Remember not to speak on your cell phone at meetings or conferences that require your undivided attention because it is perceived as just plain rude.

3. E-mails throughout the day. Stress management experts suggest emailing just two or three times a day. Wow! That seems hard for some of us to do, myself for instance. I seem to be on the computer all day and like to return e-mails ASAP but maybe it may not be a bad idea to read and reply to e-mails at scheduled hours through the day. Instant messaging is another huge source of stress. You can be working on a pleading or brief or on an important e-mail of your own and that instant messenger zaps up "are you there? What's up? What are you doing?" What are you supposed to be doing, what are you paid to be doing, and that of course is to work. You do not have to reply by instant messenger but can send a separate e-mail later in the day and explain you could not immediately respond because you were working.

4. Whether in person, by phone or by e-mail, people are constantly asking us "do you have a minute?" If you do, then give your time freely. But if you do not, let the individual know politely that you are working on something very important and it requires your full attention and you will get back to them just as soon as you can. Of course you will have lost your focus just to let the individual know that but at least you can continue working. I have always instructed the office receptionists and my assistants that when I cannot take a call or see someone not tell that person, whether it is a client or a caller, that I am busy because it sounds insulting. We are all busy. And the

individual may think that I am too busy for him or her. Instead I have instructed the office staff to please let the caller know that I am in a conference or with a client or unavailable at this time but would get back to them very soon

5. Multi-focusing is in itself an interruption. It is really hard to do a very good job on each of the tasks you are working on when you are doing many at the same time. When I was in Law School we had an old and very wise professor that told us one day people are going to pay you to think. So do not be afraid to spend time to think. It is the right thing to do. And the best way to think is just about one task at a time.

Enough said on that and now I would like to briefly report that in some recent news. A grateful thank you to Florida Supreme Court Chief Justice Fred Lewis and all who have agreed to participate in our Justice Teaching Program. An informative and educational seminar was given at the Bar Center in February. I have promised Chief Justice Lewis that the membership of the Broward County Bar Association will support all his efforts and will not disappoint him.

Chief Judge Dale Ross gave the annual State of the Circuit address at the Young Lawyers luncheon in late January. The Chief reported that the state of our Circuit is sound. A grateful thanks goes out to Judge Ross and all our Judiciary for their outstanding leadership. Our Bar Association is also sound. Our Officers, Directors, Committee Chairs and Liaisons and Bar Center staff are doing a great job. Our Bar Association has now reached well over 2800 members which is the greatest number of members ever. With your help I hope to have our membership reach 3000 before our President-Elect Barbara Sunshine is installed in June. The Chief also did an outstanding job presiding at the Judicial Robing Ceremony. It was a dignified and eloquent event and is as close to Broward County royalty as we get. The ceremony was preceded by our annual Judicial Luncheon and followed by the Judicial Reception. A special thank you to Court Administrator Carol Lee Ortman and her staff, the Broward Sheriff's Office and to BCBA Executive Director Art Goldberg and Assistant Executive Director Wilhelmina Mendoza and all who participated and attended this most outstanding ceremony. # ON GOOGLE WITH GOGGLES ON... DOES DEATH RAY WARM YOUR HEART? by Art Goldberg

I imagine the announcement last month of the development of the non-lethal death ray by Raytheon touched a lot of people. The death ray, or ray gun, has been part of futuristic fiction culture for more than a century. H.G. Wells describes the Martian weapon in 1898 in The War of Worlds as "an invisible inevitable sword of heat." Remember

the 1952 thriller *The Day The Earth Stood Still?* A most frightening vision from my childhood was the ray percolating under the visor of space robot Gort. In the classic movie, the spaceman Klaatu warns humanity that pursuit of modern weaponry would bring disaster to us all.

Whereas a ray of blasted ions is a bastion of sci-fi, let's not forget the death ray ascribed to the ancient Greek, Archimedes, whom, in the Second Century B.C., at the battle of Syracuse, supposedly raised a large mirror to redirect the sun's rays, that, as the myth proclaims, set anchored Roman warships ablaze. Long considered scientifically impossible, MIT graduate students just last year successfully mirrored (forgive the pun) Archimedes' feat that razed the Roman fleet. If you want to view their recreation of Archimedes' Death Ray (MIT used cheap mirrors from good of Home Depot) type in MIT DEATH RAY via Google. You'll need Goggles to protect your eyes. (Just kidding!)

The determination of what is truth in regard to what is fiction - especially in the realm of scientific inventions that can leave the uninformed blind to reality - was never more entertaining than the very odd story of one British inventor, H. Grindell Mathews, who was described by the New York Times in July, 1924 as *The Man Who Added New Horror To War*.

In a *nutshell*. Mathews, aka *Dr. Death Ray*, was not considered to be some kook. He was renowned for developing new naval radio navigation systems. Yet in 1924, he claimed his new death ray could stop a small running engine, cold; he also claimed that in lab experiments, the ray had killed one sad mouse, and later, one rat, at very short range. How did it work? Mathews refused to say, claiming his competitors would beat him to the punch if he shed light on the source of the science. And there were competitors - including other British, American and German inventors - racing to be the first to 'come out' with a working, lethal beam. One Edwin R. Scott of San Francisco claimed that his own death ray could fell any airplane.

Mathews demanded cash upfront from the British Military to further develop his weapon; the brass wanted to see another live demonstration before forking over the cash. Mathews refused; in a pique, he unexpectedly flew to Paris to try make a deal with the French. Sait la vie! The NYT reports that there was a dramatic mad dash - Mathews was unsuccessfully chased on his way to the airport - not by only by Brit agents asking him to reconsider, but also by a solicitor with an injunction from several claimants who declared that they owned 51% of the new death ray. It is unclear in the record if their claim was legit, though it does appear clear that you can't sell an invisible death ray if you don't really own it.

Mathews described his beam as a weapon of deterrence. "I firmly believe that it could be used to destroy an army or to stun it. Stunned by the electric beam, an enemy army could be easily captured and its use would speedily put an end to wars." (NYT, July 20, 1924) Despite the virtues - both futuristic and militaristic - of the attractive design, Matthews had his detractors. One brave volunteer from the British Air Ministry cast himself before the ray (Was he a man or a mouse?) and lived to tell the tale, demonstrating that the radiating beam was only potent against rodents in Britain.

As far as I can tell, Matthews never received funding to further his research, despite a newsreel starring the inventor at work, demonstrating the power of his ray. It even played at the Rialto in Manhattan. (NYT, Nov 23, 1924) Ironically, *Dr. Death Ray* made his name in Hollywood, and is remembered for his technical expertise in the conversion of silent movies to 'talkies'.

Raytheon's new non-lethal (deterrent?) ray supposedly works by penetrating the skin with non-damaging heat. Given what Raytheon has already unveiled, are we that far away from having a ray that can go deeper than the outer epidermis?

I certainly hope not. H.G. Wells said that the theme of <u>The War of Worlds</u> was anti-colonialism - the Martians represented the British conquering new lands. The theme of *The Day The Earth Stood Still* is but an allegory about man's un-ending pursuit of modern weapons. I still can't forget that most-terrifying scene, when the 7' 7" Gort raises his visor on the screen. (*Dramatic music up*) Remember "Klaatu , Barada, Nikto"? When Gort hears the command, he lowers his visor; his ray is not unleashed to vaporize Manhattan; it no longer presents a menace to 1950's-era earthlings.

For the lack of a more precise translation of that famous little speech, I think it served the movie's theme as a mantra for peace - three words of disarming, intergalactic dialog. What it means is "Put away your death ray:" Dare we say to Raytheon today "Klaatu, Barada, Nikto"!

Your greatest opportunity for new business in 2007 is hidden in your existing accounts. New business obtained from current or past clients tends to be more profitable, due to a lower cost of acquisition and a higher likelihood of successful completion.

It is actually fairly simple to generate new revenue from current clients by following these five business development steps:

- 1. Take a client to lunch (off the clock). Invite a high-potential client to join you for a meal at a nice local restaurant. Demonstrate your interest in their business or personal challenges, competitive environment and 2007 plans. Listen carefully to determine how your legal expertise can help the client better achieve their goals.
- 2. Up-sell and cross-sell more services. Many clients may not understand the full range of legal services your firm offers. For example, family law attorneys may also educate clients on wills and estates. If you handle Intellectual Property matters, encourage clients to consider proactive trade secret protection available through your employment law practice.
- 3. Identify and protect "at risk" accounts. In any book of business, some accounts are in danger of leaving. You can identify

these accounts by a decrease in billing patterns or less frequent communication. Take action to prevent these clients from leaving and you will improve your profitability and retention rate.

- 4. Re-establish inactive accounts. It's natural that over time some clients drift away. Identify these accounts and contact them to see what happened. Invite former clients to start using your law firm again, or at least to refer others who might use your legal services.
- 5. Conduct a client satisfaction survey. Ask your clients what you do well and where you need improvement. While this sounds scary, your clients will appreciate your interest and provide some constructive suggestions for your consideration.

Here's another secret to successful marketing: not every client is a good client. Create an "ideal client profile" and do not accept cases that you know from experience are not right for your firm.

# RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE LAW

by Nancy Little Hoffmann

1. Civil Procedure/Denial of Continuance

Fisher v. Perez,

32 Fla. L. Weekly D267 (Fla. 3rd DCA January 24, 2007).

A new trial was ordered in a car accident case because plaintiffs successfully objected to a mid-trial continuance after the defendant's only expert witness had a medical emergency. The Third District held that even though the technical requirements of rule 1.460 could not be met, the motion was legally sufficient. It was proper to make the motion orally because of the sudden nature of the emergency occurred during trial; under the circumstances supporting affidavits were not required; and the failure to subpoen the expert was not a failure to use due diligence, since the heavily medicated witness would have been unable to testify in any event. The court observed that although a trial judge ordinarily has great discretion in ruling on matters during the course of a trial, such rulings will be reversed unless they comport with fairness and due process, which was not the case here. The concurring opinions pointed out that plaintiff's counsel also intentionally misled the jury regarding the reason the witness was not present at trial, and that a mistrial should have been granted on that basis.

### 2. Civil Procedure/Failure to Plead Statute

Copeland v. Albertson's, Inc.,

32 Fla. L. Weekly D322 (Fla. 2nd DCA January 26, 2007).

After entering defendant's store, brandishing a knife and robbing a clerk, the plaintiff was caught by Albertson's employees and allegedly beaten before the police arrived. After his conviction, plaintiff sued the store and its employees, all of whom obtained a summary judgment. The pro se plaintiff appealed and obtained a reversal because although defendants argued section 776.085 as a bar, they failed to plead it or mention it in their motion for summary judgment; moreover, summary judgment could not be sustained on any of the other grounds argued.

### 3. Consumer Law

State of Florida, Office of the Attorney General v. Commerce Commercial Leasing, LLC,

32 Fla. L. Weekly D327 (Fla. 1st DCA January 26, 2007).

The trial court dismissed with prejudice the Attorney General's Florida Deceptive and Unfair Trade Practices Act complaint alleging that leasing companies engaged in a "Ponzi scheme." The trial court found that the defendants were bank subsidiaries and thus exempt from the Act. Reversing, the First District held that not all bank subsidiaries and lease financiers are necessarily exempt from the Act; that the trial court impermissibly went beyond the allegations of the complaint to support its ruling; and that the court's analysis ignored the complaint's allegations of deceptive and unfair trade practices.

4. Covenant Not to Compete/Interference with Contract

Whitby v. Infinity Radio, Inc.,

32 Fla. L. Weekly D276 (Fla. 4th DCA January 24, 2007).

Radio Station WEAT, the former employer of a Palm Beach County radio personality (Jennifer Ross), obtained a multi-million dollar compensatory damage verdict against Ross and her subsequent employer, WRMF, for allegedly breaching a non-competition agreement and intentionally interfering with that agreement. In addition, the jury awarded 13.2 million in punitive damages against WRMF. The Fourth District reversed because the trial court, among other errors, ruled the non-compete provision enforceable based on the law of the case in an earlier appeal, which had not decided that issue; granted summary judgment as to the enforceability of the provision without allowing presentation of evidence; allowed evidence of damages that was speculative and conjectural; and improperly quadrupled the amount of compensatory damages awarded by the jury by entering a judgment assessing the same amount severally against Ross and WRMF's three corporate entities.

### 5. Criminal Law/Jury Instruction

Slattery v. State,

32 Fla. L. Weekly D305 (Fla. 5th DCA January 26, 2007).

The defendant in an aggravated battery case claimed self-defense and objected to a jury instruction on the "forcible felony" exception to his self-defense claim. Although his objection was impermissibly vague, the Fifth District concluded that giving the instruction was fundamental error. It certified to the supreme court the question of whether fundamental error occurs when an erroneous jury instruction relates only to an affirmative defense and not to an essential element of the crime.

### 6. Real Property/Riparian Rights

Brannon v. Boldt.

32 Fla. L. Weekly D228 (Fla. 2nd DCA January 24, 2007).

In an en banc opinion, the Second District certified to the supreme court what it described as a very narrow, but significant issue: "What rights do the residents in a neighborhood receive, as dominant estate holders under an implied easement created by a denotation on a plat map of an 'easement for ingress and egress' to a body of water, when the servient estate is part of a residential lot on which there exists an occupied family dwelling?" The Second District concluded that the lot owners had the right to build a dock at the water's edge of the easement, and to cross their neighbor's property without delay to reach the public waters in order to launch a small boat; however, they did not have the right to remain within the easement "for extended periods to view the water, fireworks, or the sunset."
