PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On April 15, 1976, ballots will be mailed to all members of our Association and there will be held the first election under the new election procedure established by our recently adopted by-laws. In the past, because of the old election procedures, certain members of our Association had intimated that the officers of our Association and the members of our Executive Committee were members of some type closed group. The response to that charge, as is usual in an accusation of that type. was that if there was such a group it was open to anyone who was willing to spend some time and effort on behalf of our Association and our profession in general. Now we have an election procedure directly in keeping with that response; and you members this year have a greater responsibility in the selection of our leadership for next year than ever before. Your decision will be a most difficult one because you will all recognize that throughout the ballot all of the nominees possess general excellence as lawyers and experience in bar activities. In making your selections for next year, I merely remind you that the activity of your bar association on your behalf is proportionate to the time and effort given by all of those in positions of leadership. You are encouraged, therefore, to make your selections thoughtfully and to return your ballots promptly. Please also sign the outer envelope so it may be certain that only members of our Association cast ballots.

April also brings the commencement of the annual session of the Florida legislature. Hopefully through the experience this year all of our members realize the importance of this legislature session. Each of our members simply must keep abreast of that which is happening in the legislature. Jim Scott, who is chairman of our Legislature Liaison Committee, has reported that as of March 15, there were pending for legislative consideration some 21 measures which, if passed, would have an adverse effect on our profession and through that on each of us. Lawyers in Florida may no longer sit passively by while their representatives consider matters which may ultimately be harmful to them and to the jurisprudence of their state. You are encouraged, therefore, to make your views known to our delegation; because your silence on important matters may be reasonably considered to show your approval of the actions being taken. The members of the Broward delegation have shown that they are receptive to your views, but they need to hear from you so they will know your position and also so that they will realize that you are following their positions on important questions. Let us make our voices heard during this session on those matters which are important to us as citizens of Florida and particularly on those items which are important to the jurisprudence of our State.

COURT DECISIONS

Greene vs. The City of Sunrise 323 So2nd 30, upheld Judge Fischer's ruling that Sunrise Police in hot pursuit beyond their municipal limits could arrest one harrassing and threatening the officer as he was writing out the traffic violator's ticket. Chief Judge Walden in writing the opinion upheld the City of Sunrise's charter and under the Florida Statute 901.25 the power to arrest beyond the corporate limits when the crime or violation was within the municipality and pursuit took the police outside his jurisdiction. The limit seems to be that outside the municipality must mean within the same county and relying upon an attorney general's opinion, which held that it is a necessary implication that if the Legislature intended the pursuing officer to have authority to arrest beyond his municipal limits then he would also have authority to arrest any third person knowingly and willingly obstructing him while in the process of fresh pursuit or while arresting the pursued violator. The Judge having given a correct and accurate interpretation of the law and charge to the jury, the lower court was affirmed.

This case is interesting not only in its constitutional application as well as the interpretation or existing statutory law, but in its reliance upon an attorney general's opinion rather than existing case law supporting its position and also the natural implications as to just how far can the pursuing officer's authority go. For example, should the pursuing officer see a violent rape occur in front of his

eyes while he is in the process of ticketing a speed violator outside his municipality does he have the authority to arrest for such a crime. Obviously he does as a citizen under citizens' arrest for a felony committed in his presence. It would appear that his authority is limited to his particular fresh pursuit and arrest. Assuming on the other hand that the fresh pursuit brought a non-related crime, such as possession of marijuana found in the car under the seat after the arrest for fresh pursuit, would that be considered within the res gestae of the original violation? Perhaps further case law or legislation will define the authority of an officer in hot pursuit beyond his municipal jurisdiction.

Humanities Seminar For Lawyers

The National Endowment for the Humanities will expand its program of humanities seminars for practicing lawyers and judges, supporting four seminars in the summer of 1976. The program will bring four distinguished humanists from the fields of philosophy, history and political science together with practicing lawyers for a month of full-time study. The seminars will be held in Arizona, California, Illinois and Massachusetts.

Up to 15 participants will attend each seminar tuition free and will receive a \$1,200 stipend to cover expenses, plus reimbursement for travel up to a \$300 maximum. Participants may be accompanied by members of their families, but

the stipend will not be increased.

Selection of participants will be made by the seminar directors with the advice of selection committees. Applications are invited from lawyers, with at least five years of professional experience, in all sectors of legal employment, including private firms, the judiciary, administrative agencies, and the various levels of government, corporate legal staffs, and community organizations. Lawyers with full-time academic appointments are ineligible. The application deadline for the Rosary College seminar is April 15, with selections to be announced about April 22. The application deadline for the other seminars is April 30; selections will be announced about May 10. For further information call Broward County Bar Association, 764-8040.


