MECHANICS' LIENS

Priorities F.S. 713.13(5), Florida Statutes 1975 provides that a Notice of Commencement is not effective "as to any person acquiring title or any interest in real property from the owner or under him after one year from the date of recording and Notice of Commencement".

In United of Florida v. Illini Fed. S & L Assoc., 2d DCA No. 76-459,-504, Jan. 12, 1977, the trial court held that the liens of certain mortgages obtained after one year from the recording of the Notice of Commencement were superior to certain Mechanics' Liens. The D.C.A. reversed, but under the rationale that the mortgages were not "any interest in Real Property".

Lawyers Title Guaranty Fund has traditionally taken the position that the one one year effective life provided for in the statute could not be relied upon to insure title to Real Property over a possible claim of Mechanics' Liens which could revert back to the date of the filing of the Notice of Commencement. Based on this case, the Fund has changed its position according to Robert H. Threadgill, Vice President of the Fund. The Fund will now allow reliance upon the statute as to Deeds actually delivered more than one year after the Notice of Commencement.

Highlights of the Board of Governors Meeting of The Florida Bar

* * * * *

The Board of Governors took the following actions at its recent meeting:

- 1. Voted to request the Supreme Court to rescind a By-Law requiring all lawyers to file an annual certificate that their trust accounts are in compliance with the Code of Professional Responsibility. The Board took this action based upon a report indicating that the time and cost of such procedure may be disproportionate to the benefit received.
 - 2. Approved an amendment to the At-

torney/Realtor Accord to create joint grievance panels formed of members of both professions to receive complaints and conciliate differences between attorneys and realtors.

- 3. Tabled a recommendation by the Disciplinary Procedure Committee to amend the Integration Rule to grant limited transactional immunity to complainants from suits by lawyers after no probable cause has been found by a grievance committee. More study of this proposal was felt needed before adding this to the grievance procedures in Florida.
- 4. Filed the reports of the Bar's Committee to study reapportionment of the Board of Governors. A motion to re-apportion the Board by Bill Leonard, seconded by Don Norman, adding one more member for Broward and one more for each of the two next most mal-apportioned circuits was tabled. Your board members will continue to work for reapportionment of the Board of Governors.
- 5. Approved a report by the Judicial Poll Committee recommending preference polls for Judges in an election year and performance polls for Judges in non-election years, with the performance poll to be kept absolutely confidential by the Bar Association and all Judges involved.
- 6. Heard a report of the Committee lawyer advertising which recommended awaiting the Supreme Court's decision in the Arizona case presently before it. Heard a report that Maine now permits

lawyer advertising with the only restriction being against deception.

- 7. Heard a report that the Young Lawyers had a successful convention, with 474 young lawyers registered and 550 attending their annual banquet. The Young Lawyers Section continues to be very active in many areas of the Bar's
- 8. Heard a report from the committee liaison representative to the Board of Florida Bar Examiners that there has been no action taken on recommendations for a residency requirement and a more difficult bar examination with minimum passing levels. These matters are presently pending before the Supreme Court.
- 9. Referred a report on the Committee for Fee Arbitration Act to the Committee for revision of a proposed statewide fee arbitration plan. The proposed plan did not contain complete mutuality of rights for the lawyer as well as the client.
- 10. Deferred a proposal to restructure the Board of Directors of the Florida Legal Services until the May meeting of the Board of Governors at Key Biscayne. It has been proposed to restructure the Board to permit Florida Legal Services to receive Federal funds for its work.
- 11. Heard a report from the Designation Coordinating Committee regarding new areas of designation. Changed an area to read Marital and Family Law. Abolished the designation of Consumer Law and created two new areas of Immigration and Naturalization Law and Aviation Law.
- 12. Voted to accept a definition of tax law practice offered by the Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee with the advice of the Tax Section.
- 13. Voted to dispute a tax on the mortgage on The Florida Bar Center.
- 14. Voted to support efforts by Judicial Nominating Commissions to deliberate confidentially where the committee chooses to do so.
- 15. Approved a recommendation to increase the fee for approval of pre-paid lgeal service plans to more nearly cover the cost of supervision.
- 16. Approved a bill offered by the Workmen's Compensation Section regarding revisions of Chapter 440 with particular reference to attorneys' fees. While the Board felt the gravest reservations regarding any statutory regulation of an attorney's fee, it voted to permit the Section to represent the Workmen's Compensation Bar in proposing a compromise to certain proposed legislation adversely affecting the award of

an attorney's fee in this area by bringing in the standards of the Code of Professional Responsibility into the award of the fee with discretion in the Judge of Industrial Claims to award a fee in each case as under present law.

17. The Board disapproved a proposal of the Family Law Section to amend Chapter 61 to permit alimony to be awarded after an annulment of marriage and permit a court to discontinue alimony when a former spouse was living with another person of the opposite sex and holding themselves out as married although not actually espoused to such person. The Board felt that the bill should be re-drafted by the Family Law Section.

18. The Board continued its interest in the legislative policy of The Bar with a full-time outside general legislative counsel as well as full-time staff support for this very important activity.

19. Heard that The Florida Bar Center drive had less than \$50,000 to go to meet its goal of \$1,500,000 for the complete new building addition.

20. Heard a report by the Travel Committee that a charter flight from Miami to Luxembourg leaving August 7th and returning August 24th will be offered to members of The Florida Bar for \$349 on Icelandic Airways. This will be at absolutely no cost to The Florida Bar for any item of expense involved in this charter flight.
