PRE-PAID LEGAL SERVICES **GROW**

As of early December, fifty - seven Broward County attorneys had enrolled with Florida Lawyers Pre-Paid Legal Services Corporation, Inc., The Florida Bar sponsored pre-paid legal services

Many experts are convinced that the future of legal services for middle-class Americans will be dominated by prepaid clients. Some approved plans are "closed panel" plans which require the participants to utilize the services of a specific firm or group of attorneys. The Florida Bar sponsored plan is an "open panel" which means that all attorneys authorized to practice law in the state of Florida and who wish to participate. enroll in the plan.

It is felt that employers who wish to expand their existing employees benefits will subscribe to the new plan. The plan provides scheduled benefits for specific legal services. Services not specifically included within the plan, such as the issuance of title insurance and the handling of personal injury cases, would be negotiated between the attorney and the client subsequent to the subsidized initial conference.

As recently reported in the Florida Bar News, two groups have recently subscriped to the program: The Saint Lucie Postal Credit Union in Fort Pierce and the Seminole Governmental Employees Credit Union in Sanford.
