Broward County Bar Association Wins Award of Merit

The Broward County Bar Association has won a first prize award in statewide competition for its Special Committee for the Needs of Children.

The Bar won in the new projects category in the annual Awards of Merit competition conducted by The Florida Bar and the Florida Council of Bar Association Presidents.

Awards were presented June 29 during the four-day convention of The Florida Bar at the Boca Raton Hotel & Club.

Judge Larry Seidlin, who chairs the award-winning committee, said the Broward Bar created the committee "to respond to the needs of children, to raise the consciousness and gain the support of leaders and citizens in the community and to achieve a commitment of resources to the needs of children."

Among the projects of the 40-member committee are drug and alcohol abuse seminars, a guardian ad-litem program through which lawyers contribute probono time for children, and tours of juvenile programs for lawyers and judges.

Seidlin said the committee now is creating a Family Development Institute at Broward Community College addressing parenting skills, early childhood education and child abuse.

Judge Selectors Sought

Two non-attorneys are being sought for the committee that nominates persons to be appointed Broward circuit and county judges.

The two vacancies on the 17th Judicial Circuit Nominating Commission must be filled by registered voters who reside in Broward and who are not attorneys admitted to practice law in Florida.

A new circuit judgeship was created for Broward by the recent legislative session, and this position must be filled by appointment before January 1.

The nominating commission screens candidates for this position and vacancies among Broward's 60 existing circuit and county judgeships. The governor makes the appointment from three nominees.

"This is an opportunity for a Broward citizen to discharge a volunteer community service," Terrence Russell, acting chairman of the 17th Judicial Circuit

Nominating Commission, said. "It's a lot of responsibility but not much glory."

Interested persons should submit their original resume and six copies describing their background and community involvement, and their reasons for wishing to serve on the commission, to Russell not later than July 8.



Attorney Errors Prove Headache for Clerk's Office

The Broward County Clerk's Office kept statistics for the Continuing Education Committee of the Broward Bar during this past year to zero in on attorney errors or negligences which cause inefficiency in the Clerk's Office and thus add to the slowdown of processing our legal work. The following are some of the more prominent errors committed weekly by many attorneys on pleadings filed with the Clerk's Office:

- 1. Wrong case numbers
- Wrong judge or no judge on pleadings
- 3. No signature on pleadings
- 4. No case number on pleadings
- 5. Wrong county
- No address or phone number for attorney

We feel certain that many of these errors are typographical or just because of a heavy caseload and the attendant time pressure. However, in a sense of cooperation for all of us to help improve the flow of paperwork through the court system, which amounts to over 700,000 pleadings a year in Broward County alone, we wanted to bring this to your attention and your secretary's in hopes that the knowledge would make us all a little more careful in the future.
